Helping Students Prepare For The TOEIC

What is the single most significant factor determining the EFL learner's success in mastering English? I firmly believe it is the EFL learner's information-processing speed. If the EFL learner can process the information (English words) he or she is reading or listening to very quickly, he or she will be able to master English without a tremendous amount of effort. In order to process the information (English words) used in oral and written English communication very quickly, one must have cognitive flexibility. The most effective way to help students to master English is to help them increase their information-processing speed through enhancing their cognitive flexibility. Using brainpowerboosting Lateral Thinking Exercises that I created has been one of the methods I have used while conducting TOEIC training during the academic year. I created a number of Lateral Thinking Exercises, and have used them to enhance my students' cognitive flexibility and creativity. The more cognitive flexibility a person has, the faster he or she will be able to process English, and the faster he or she can be expected to master the language.

The brainpower-boosting Lateral Thinking Exercises that I created have been used to maximize my students' language-learning potential by enhancing their cognitive flexibility and thinking-out-of-the-box skills. The Lateral Thinking Exercises have stimulated my students' free-range thinking, and have developed their problem-solving and information-processing skills.

Doing the Lateral Thinking Exercises has enhanced my students' creativity. Thousands

of books have been written about creativity, and definitions of the word vary considerably, but, in a nutshell, it is the process of thinking, exploring, discovering, and imagining whereby original ideas are created. A creative person generates original ideas, and these can be used to generate other original ideas.

Unfortunately, there are still many EFL learners that haven't the slightest idea what a Lateral Thinking Exercise is, and have never had an opportunity to use brainpower-boosting Lateral Thinking Exercises to help them master English. Here is an example of a Lateral Thinking Exercise:

Marcia was violent. Marcia seriously injured ten people in a town in less than twenty-four hours. The local police knew what Marcia did. However, it was impossible for the police to punish Marcia. How can this be?

If someone tried to solve this Lateral Thinking Exercise by taking a vertical thinking approach, he or she would probably have a great deal of difficulty solving it because he or she would try to solve it based on his or her assumption that Marcia was a human being. However, if someone tried to solve this Lateral Thinking Exercise by taking a lateral thinking approach, he or she would probably be able to solve it in a short amount of time without a great deal of effort because he or she wouldn't assume that Marcia was a human being. In this Lateral Thinking Exercise, Marcia was not a human being. Marcia was a hurricane. Hurricanes are often given human names. When the person trying to solve the Lateral Thinking Exercise understands that Marcia was a hurricane, it makes sense that it was impossible for the

police to punish Marcia. How could a hurricane be punished? Obviously, a hurricane couldn't be punished. One possible answer for this Lateral Thinking Exercise is "Marcia was a hurricane. Therefore, it was impossible for the police to punish Marcia." During the academic year I have taught my students how to take a lateral thinking approach. Taking a lateral thinking approach enhances cognitive flexibility, and makes experiences in life more stimulating, because it frees people from the rigid control of vertical thinking.

The TOEIC Training

During the academic year I have conducted TOEIC training for junior high and high school students in seminars and in the Special English Class. The seminars have been held once per week after school and during the Summer Seminar. The Special English Class consists of 7th, 8th and 9th graders who have displayed a special ability in English. The class has been held twice per week. I have conducted the TOEIC training to help my students acquire the skills needed to perform successfully on the TOEIC, and to enable them to master English in the least amount of time and with the least amount of effort.

I have used numerous brain-stimulating activities and a great deal of material for the TOEIC training, including brainpower-boosting Lateral Thinking Exercises that I created. The students who have received the TOEIC training have been given many opportunities to engage in exploratory thinking using their predicting, hypothesizing, inferring and deducing skills. By doing Lateral Thinking Exercises and other brain-stimulating exercises and activities they have gained a deeper understanding of the four

steps needed for rational problem solving: (1) defining the problem, (2) generating alternatives, (3) evaluating alternatives, and (4) implementing a solution.

I have conducted the TOEIC training using exercises and activities that have stimulated the students' free-range thinking, developed their problem-solving and information-processing skills, and increased their information-processing speed. As my students have engaged in exploratory thinking, using predicting, hypothesizing, inferring and deducing skills to solve the Lateral Thinking Exercises that I created and to do the other exercises and activities that I have given them, they have acquired the skills needed to perform successfully on the TOEIC and have raised their level of English comprehension significantly.

The Results Of The TOEIC Training

The students who received the TOEIC training that I conducted have acquired the skills needed to perform successfully on the TOEIC. I'm very pleased to report that after receiving my TOEIC training, one student scored 900 on his TOEIC, another 870, another 850, two others 665, another 650, another 595, another 550, and another 530. After receiving my TOEIC training, one student was able to raise his TOEIC score from 460 to 665.

Lateral Thinking Exercises

I created the following brainpower-boosting Lateral Thinking Exercises. These are some of the Lateral Thinking Exercises that I used while conducting TOEIC training for students during the academic year. I have provided one answer for each of them. This is not the only answer possible.

1. An elevator in a skyscraper has a maximum weight capacity of 500 kilograms. If the weight of the people in the elevator exceeds 500 kilograms, a buzzer buzzes and the elevator door will not shut. The elevator's weight monitor is functioning properly. A man weighing 80 kilograms is waiting for an elevator on the first floor of the skyscraper. He wants to go to the 23rd floor. The elevator door opens and the man enters the empty elevator. The elevator goes to the 5th floor. The elevator door opens. A woman weighing 50 kilograms enters the elevator. The tallest man enters the elevator first, the second tallest man enters second, the second shortest man enters next, and the shortest man enters last. He is carrying a ten-kilogram dumb-bell in his right hand. He is on his way to the fitness center located on the 20th floor. When the man carrying the dumb-bell enters the elevator, the buzzer doesn't buzz. How can this be?

ANSWER: The man weighing 80 kilograms got out of the elevator on the 5th floor. After he had gotten into the elevator on the first floor, he remembered he needed to do something on the 5th floor before going to the 23rd floor.

2. The stowaway had traveled thousands of kilometers to the United States on a cargo ship. The dock inspector who had found the stowaway had only been on the job for a few months. He was wondering what he should do with the stowaway. For all he knew, the stowaway could be very dangerous. He decided to take the stowaway to his office. The dock inspector expected the

stowaway to attempt an escape. He wasn't sure how he could stop the stowaway from escaping. He phoned the security office at the dock and asked his friend, a security officer, to come to his office immediately. The dock inspector wanted his friend to see the stowaway. He thought he would know what to do in that kind of situation. The dock inspector looked out the windows of his office waiting impatiently for his friend to arrive.
